

Following the presentation by the Director St John's College of Science & Technology: www.stjohns.ac.ug, Mr. Asau Sunday when RIN hosted a Refugee Entrepreneurship Showcase in celebration of World Refugee Day 2022, featuring entrepreneurs from their Resilient 100 program. Speakers shared their experiences leading refugee lens enterprises in Turkey, Uganda, and Germany, and offered lessons learned in building refugee self-reliance. The director shared his entrepreneurial journey of flexibility and resilience in the development of his inclusive college, along with his vision for the future.
